SNOW REMOVAL

With more than 15 inches of snow falling within the last week and a half, staff of the General Services Department have been challenged trying to plow roads, clear sidewalks and remove snow. Crews worked diligently on Tuesday night of this week removing snow from downtown and the surrounding area. Staff continues to clear snow from the sidewalks and has also started removing snow from the smaller side streets that have been narrowed from the snowbanks and posted with emergency “No Parking” signs. With no end in sight, and another storm predicted for this weekend, the City appreciates the public’s continued patience as crews work to keep up with all of the snow that has fallen and continues to fall.
