DOWNTOWN COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT

Last week's rain caused some minor setbacks in the construction on South Main Street. To make up some time, two small crews will be working on Saturday (April 9th). This work will take place in the street portion of the work zone only, as crews will be lowering existing manhole frames to prepare for the reclaiming of pavement later next week. On Monday, south-bound lane shifts will occur in front of the Concord Food Co-op and at Theatre Street, as crews conduct underground utility work. Sidewalk demolition will continue on Monday and Tuesday as well. On Wednesday, crews will be reclaiming work zone pavement from Pleasant Street to Constantly Pizza. Thursday will include night work beginning at 11:00 PM, as well as a controlled domestic water shutoff between Hills Avenue and Thorndike Street, in order for crews to perform utility work. Water service will be restored by 6:00 AM on Friday.



SEWALLS FALLS BRIDGE


This past week, concrete was placed for the north abutment footing; the existing granite pier in the river was demolished; drainage on the south side of the project was installed; and work continued on the north extension to the temporary work platform. Next week, stone will be placed for the slope in front of the remaining portion of the existing south abutment; formwork will be set for the north abutment stem and lower pilasters; drainage will continue to be installed; and construction will begin on the south extension to the temporary work platform.



ROUTE 3 CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS

Work at the intersection of Fisherville and Manor Roads will begin on Monday, April 11th, replacing a deep section of sewer main. In order to complete this work safely, Manor Road from Fisherville Road to Welch Street will be closed to all traffic, including emergency vehicles. A detour will be established for commuters utilizing Manor Road. Some additional sewer and drain repair work will continue throughout the week. Commuters can expect minor delays with alternating one-way traffic through the work zone.


