CITY CEMETERIES PREPARE FOR MEMORIAL DAY

The Cemetery staff, with assistance from staff of the Parks & Recreation Department and the General Services Department's Highway & Utilities Division, have been very busy preparing the cemeteries for Memorial Day. In addition to mowing and trimming, staff have prepared 416 flower beds at the cemeteries and planted thousands of flowers (funds for which are provided by the Flower Trust Fund). The Cemetery Office worked with veterans to develop a list and maps for American flag placement for the 3,500 veterans buried in Concord cemeteries. American flags have been placed by volunteers in all of the City's cemeteries. The Cemetery Office at Blossom Hill has additional American flags available for any veterans, if needed. The Cemetery Office at Blossom Hill will be open from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM all weekend and on Memorial Day.



MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

This year's Memorial Day Parade will be held on Monday, May 30th, at 9:00 AM. The parade will depart from the Burlington Coat Factory parking lot on Storrs Street and will proceed up Pleasant Street Extension to Main Street. The parade will turn right onto Main Street and proceed to Franklin Street, where it will take a left. The parade will then turn left onto State Street, then left onto Court Street, then right onto North Main Street for the closing ceremony at the State House Plaza.

MAIN STREET PROJECT

The streetscape on the east side of South Main Street is rapidly taking shape. A base layer of pavement is down and curbing is in. At the Pleasant Street end of the work zone, crews have poured concrete sidewalks, installed granite planters and bike racks, placed trees, and erected streetlights. A crew has begun laying granite tiles near the Endicott Hotel and we can expect to see more progress next week, as they continue south with granite and brick hardscape installation.



Next week, crews will not be working on Monday, in observance of Memorial Day. Beginning on Tuesday, the sidewalk areas near Bread and Chocolate, Constantly Pizza, and Abbott Bennett Group, extending to Theater Street, will be graded and paved. Also next week, installation of the snowmelt system in front of the Smile and Love buildings will begin, an amenity which was paid for by the buildings' owner.

CITY OFFICES CLOSED

In observance of Memorial Day, City offices and the Concord Public Library will be closed on Monday, May 30th.


HOLIDAY SCHEDULE FOR TRASH/RECYCLING

WHITE PARK FOUNTAIN LIGHTS



After many years of being out of service, the fountain lights at White Park will be officially turned back on tonight. The red, white and blue lights will be turned on nightly around 8:30 PM and turned off at 11:00 PM, when the park officially closes.

EXIT 12 / SOUTH MAIN PAVING



Evening paving for the I-93 Exit 12 / South Main Street area will continue next week, beginning on Tuesday, May 31st, at 6:00 PM. The NH Department of Transportation is overseeing the operation, which is being performed by Continental Paving. The paving will be done on South Main Street, from Broadway Street to the Bow town line, and may take a couple of nights, depending on the weather. One-way traffic will be maintained through the work zone and traffic delays are expected. Motorists are encouraged to seek alternate routes.

WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT: CROSS STREET

On Tuesday, May 31st, Cross Street will be closed from Summer Street south to the end, while the contractor begins the installation of a new 8-inch water main at the intersection of Cross and Shaw Streets. Traffic will be detoured to Steeple View. This work will require the water to be shut off on Cross and Shaw Streets from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM on Tuesday. The remainder of the week will focus on installing the new water main on Cross Street, between Shaw Street and the park.



CITY CONDUCTS ACTIVE SHOOTER EXERCISE

On Saturday, May 14th, the Concord Police and Fire Departments joined with Concord High School, Concord Hospital, and several other public safety agencies to conduct a very realistic active shooter exercise. The exercise took several hours and represented the culmination of several months of planning and training to assure that all agencies are ready to respond to such an incident and to work together with maximum efficiency to bring an incident under control and treat patients. The exercise was funded by the NH Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management.


