### MAIN STREET

Next week, the South Main Street work area, from Pleasant Street to Fayette Street, will continue to be very active with excavation and placement of underground structures like storm drain catch basins and utility conduit.

On Monday, July 25th, the old pavement in the work zone will be removed. It will then be regraded and a new base coat of asphalt will be laid down on Friday. Fayette Street will be closed at South Main Street for most of next week during working hours. However, local traffic will be able to access private parking lots, as well as the public parking lot behind the former Employment Security building. The Concord Food Co-op parking lot will be open at all times. Unutil will be on-site next week doing work to prepare for placement of their power lines underground later this summer. Severino Construction crews will be working both this Saturday and next lowering in-street manhole covers and installing street light pole bases.

The intense construction activity in the area between Pleasant Street and Fayette Street will moderate after next week when the crew laying conduit moves south of Fayette Street. As always, the construction schedule is weather dependent and subject to change.



### STUDENTS VISIT WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Students from St. Paul's School visited the Water Treatment Plant this past week for their annual water quality gathering session. The Ecology students come each year to gather water samples from Penacook Lake to test for clarity (the canoes are cleaned at the school and thoroughly inspected by City staff to protect the lake from invasive aquatic species). St. Paul's School has been gathering data from Penacook Lake for over 20 years.

### NORTHERN PASS WORKSHOP

Community members are invited to participate in a structured workshop to identify places and areas of beauty, use, history, and tradition that are within 10 miles of the proposed Northern Pass transmission corridor that may be affected by the Northern Pass Project (NP Project). The workshop will be held on **Thursday, July 28th**, at **6:00 PM**, at the **Heights Community Center**, 14 Canterbury Road, Concord.

The workshop is being held by Peter C.L. Roth of the NH Attorney General's Office, who represents the interests of the public in the Site Evaluation Committee (SEC) proceeding to review the application of the NP Project. Mr. Roth has engaged experts to provide evidence on the NP Project's potential impacts on the State's scenic, historic and cultural resources. The SEC must consider these impacts in assessing proposed energy projects.
