CITY OFFICES CLOSED

City offices and the Concord Public Library will be closed on Monday, October 10th, in observance of Columbus Day.



MAIN STREET PROJECT

Despite it being a holiday, crews will be working downtown on Monday. During the latter part of next week, the existing South Main Street work zone and the Pleasant Street intersection are scheduled to receive their top coat of pavement. Striping will occur approximately two days after the paving. Also next week, crews will be working to finish the sidewalks on South Main Street, and a crew will be working on North Main Street to install accent lighting (uplighting) at the clock tower and at the War Memorial at City Plaza in front of the State House. As always, this work is weather dependent.



The existing work zone will remain in place and be active after paving, as the utility companies still have a lot of work to do and need room to do it safely. For a closer look at some of this work, check out the latest edition of Concord TV's [Main Street Minute](#).

E-Z PAY FOR WATERSENSE CONTEST

Concord General Services is hosting its "E-Z Pay for WaterSense" contest, for the third consecutive year, in celebration of October being EPA WaterSense's "Shower Better Month." All Concord water customers who are enrolled in the City's automatic utility billing payment plan, E-Z Pay, as of October 21, 2016, will be entered for a chance to win one of five high-performance WaterSense labeled showerheads. Customers can enroll in E-Z Pay in person at the Utility Billing Office at 311 North State Street; or by printing, completing and returning the [online enrollment form](#). E-Z Pay automatically pays your bill from your bank account, so you never have to worry about a late payment. Customers enrolled in E-Z Pay still receive a bill summary, which includes the date the authorized bank account will be drafted.

SEWALLS FALLS BRIDGE

Throughout September, a continued robust construction schedule has brought into focus what the final Sewalls Falls bridge and roadway are going to look like when completed. The bridge deck, sidewalks, overlooks, and brush curbs have been completed, as well as the approach slabs, surrounding slopes, and drainage swales. Base paving has been completed from Manor Road to Monitor Way, leading the way to installation of curbing and the construction of sidewalks over the next week or so.



Next week, bridge and guard-rail installation will begin, as well as the continued relocation of utility poles and wires along Sewalls Falls Road. Installation of the bridge deck membrane and final paving is scheduled for the week of October 17th. The project is expected to be completed by the first week of November.
