SEWALLS FALLS BRIDGE OPENING

VETERANS DAY LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection officially began on October 31st and will continue, as weather permits, through December 9th. **City offices are closed tomorrow for Veterans Day**, but General Services' crews will be out collecting leaves in the area surrounding Concord High School (which is also closed for the holiday), where on-street parking typically occurs. The public should avoid parking cars next to leaf piles in this area, as it blocks the equipment from collecting leaves safely. Crews will resume leaf collection in their designated areas after the holiday.

Leaves must be un-bagged and kept tight to the curb to keep roads and sidewalks clear. Unfortunately it may be the case for some residents that not all leaves have fallen before crews arrive for collection. Crews have a limited timeframe to collect leaves throughout the city, and there will only be time for crews to come by areas once. If the weather holds, and there is time, crews will try to make a second round. Residents may bring leaves to Earth Materials Recycling Center for free if the load size is smaller than a non-commercial pick-up truck. Visit www.concordnh.gov/leafcollection for more info.
