65th ANNUAL CHRISTMAS PARADE



The 65th Annual Concord Christmas Parade will be held on **Saturday, November 19th**, at **9:30 AM**. The parade will depart from the John O. Morton Building on Hazen Drive, travel south to Loudon Road, then travel east on Loudon Road to Old Loudon Road where it will disband behind Dick's Sporting Goods. Loudon Road will be closed to all traffic from Hazen Drive to the area of the Steeplegate Mall. Northbound traffic on Airport Road will be allowed to turn west onto Loudon Road, and after the parade crosses, will be able to cross northerly to Hazen Drive. Access to the Steeplegate Mall will be from Loudon Road westbound or from Route 106. Rain date is Sunday, November 20th, at 2:00 PM.
