WINTER NEWS FROM BEAVER MEADOW

Thank you to all who helped make this 120th season at Beaver Meadow Golf Course one of our best ever. Although the outdoor golf season is over, we are gearing up for a great winter season!



Staff recently installed the seasonal PGA AboutGolf Simulator in the Pro Shop. The course's two simulators have been upgraded to provide a total of 60 courses to choose from. Hazeltine National, host of the 2016 Ryder Cup, is now included to challenge your game. Additional updates to our already fabulous collection of courses include Pebble Beach National, Spyglass Hills, Bay Harbor, and of course the three famous courses of St. Andrews. We also have several mini-golf courses for the kids. Indoor winter leagues are forming now and all abilities are welcome.

Beaver Meadow is extremely pleased and fortunate to welcome back Ben Stone, PGA Apprentice from Laconia Country Club, for the winter season. Ben started working on the crew at Beaver Meadow as a college student studying sports management. After a career in sports management, Ben enrolled in the Golf School of America, graduating in 2015. After the 2015 season as the Assistant at Beaver Meadow, he wintered in South Dakota, working with simulators in a sports bar there. Ben and our PGA Head Golf Professional, Phil Davis, will be available this winter for private and small group indoor lessons.

In other news, as soon as the ground is frozen and the course accumulates 6+ inches of snow, we will begin grooming over 4K of cross country ski trails. Between the 19th Hole Bar and Grill, indoor simulators, cross country skiing, and ice skating, Beaver Meadow is fast becoming one of Concord's best winter destinations.

Concord General Services unleashed the snow plows this week due to accumulating snowfall on Monday and Wednesday. Crews shifted priority from fall leaf collection to plowing streets and sidewalks. Fortunately, leaf collection had been completed for most areas of the city before the weather changed, but there are still some areas in the outskirts that crews have not yet reached. Once the snow was no longer a focus, and the weather improved, crews were able to return to leaf collection. However, with increasing amounts of snow and ice on the ground, fall leaf collection becomes complicated and slower. Continuation of leaf collection to the outskirts of the city will depend on weather conditions next week.

Residents may bring their remaining leaves to Earth Materials Recycling Center, but are advised to call the site first at 545-4835 to confirm their hours, as weather conditions affect their operation.
