Concord Fire Department Responds to Multiple Fires

CONCORD, NH (March 12, 2021)- On March 10, 2021 at 7:09 a.m., Captain Mick Costello was traveling on Interstate 89 and observed a column of smoke in the area of Hopkinton Road. Costello investigated and found a chicken coop on fire at a residence. Captain Costello was able to keep the fire in check by using portable fire extinguishers with the assistance of the homeowner, until Engine 4 and Ambulance 4 from the Broadway Station arrived to finish extinguishing the fire.

At 10:37 a.m. on the same day, Engine 7, Tower 1 and the Battalion Chief responded for a fire alarm on Manchester Street. Upon arrival, the cause of the alarm was a dryer fire that the occupant had extinguished. Units on scene checked for extension to make sure the fire was completely extinguished.

On March 12, 2021 at 1:25 a.m., Engine 7 and Ambulance 7 from the Heights Station, along with Tower 1 and the Battalion Chief from Central Station, responded to Burger King on Loudon Road for a fire alarm. Upon arrival, the crew from Engine 7 noticed a smoke condition throughout the building and called for an additional Engine to the scene. Upon investigation, crews found an outside fire that extended into the building, causing a partition fire. Station 7 was able to quickly extinguish the fire and had to open up areas of the wall to check for extension.

The Fire Prevention Bureau would like to remind the public to properly secure heating appliances, regularly clean lint traps and properly dispose of smoking materials.
