City of Concord & McFarland Johnson Receive ACEC-NH Gold Award

Each year the ACEC sponsors a national Engineering Excellence Awards Program, which is facilitated by the individual State chapters to recognize engineering projects which epitomize quality, innovation, value and client satisfaction.
