From a modest beginning as a small wood and lumber business, established by Arthur G. Stevens in October 1904, the history of the Concord Lumber Company, Concord, N. H., has been one of steady growth, with the result that today the company is recognized as one of the leading building material firms in the state, with 65 employees and an annual payroll of over \$300,000. The company pays taxes to the amount of approximately \$15,500 in the City of Concord.

In addition to selling box shook, masons' supplies, and building materials of stock design, Concord Lumber Company also manufactures detail millwork to architect's design. Doors, windows, cabinets and other woodwork in many churches, schools and public buildings in the Concord area were made to detail in the company's modern mill by skilled workmen. A modern office and display room, together with a staff of employees, some of whom have over forty years' experience, assures complete building materials service second to none.

It was in 1915 that the founder's son, Arthur W. Stevens, became part owner of the business, and it remained under his management until his death in October 1962. In April of 1964 the business was purchased by the Gallup Lumber Company of Plainfield, Conn. The Gallup Company also owns and operates two retail lumber yards in Connecticut, Annett Lumber Company in Jaffrey, N. H., Lumbertown Incorporated in Raymond, N. H., and a sawmill in Ashland, N. H. C. Stanton Gallup is president of both companies; John L. Saturley of Pembroke, N. H., is manager of the Concord yard.
